

Little Lawrences: Our story of the week has been Goldilocks and the Three bears. The children have considered how each of the bears were feeling after Goldilocks had damaged their belongings. By looking at the characters facial expressions we talked about what emotion they were feeling and when the children may have felt like that too. Some of the children learnt the new emotion shocked and we talked about how this may feel on our bodies. We have also been busy practising our Christmas Nativity and performed this for year 1; this is a huge achievement for everyone as this is a new experience for them - all the adults are really proud!

Reception : This week in Reception class we have been reading more traditional tales, focussing on the story of Goldilocks and the 3 bears. The children have loved all the activities linked to this wonderful story and have been making masks, writing sorry letters from Goldilocks, sorting objects by size and making and taste testing porridge! They have drawn maps to the 3 bears cottage and have even tried writing and illustrating their own stories. Millie inspired this when she brought in her own Rapunzel story book! The frost caused great excitement on Thursday and led the children to take photos of beautiful icy objects and to create their own 'ice cafe!' Lots of science experiments also ensued. Alongside all of this we have been rehearsing our Nativity play!

Year 1: This week, Year 1 have been incredibly busy and full of enthusiasm! We have been working hard rehearsing for our Christmas show, which is now just over a week away, and the children have been absolutely brilliant, showing fantastic focus and confidence. In our topic work, we enjoyed learning about village homes in Kenya and comparing them to our own homes, noticing both similarities and differences. In English, we have been retelling stories, while in Maths we have been exploring how addition and subtraction are linked through fact families. We also really enjoyed taking part in Spirituality Day, where we spent time thinking about the meaning of Advent and why it is an important time of preparation and reflection.



In computing, Year 1 have used the technique of pointillism to create these fantastic pictures of flowers using the computer app Paintz and compared them to their pictures using paint and cotton buds.

Year 2: We have been very busy again this week. Our Nativity is beginning to take shape as the children learn their lines and the songs. Thank you to everyone who is helping out with this at home. We will be putting more songs on Google Classroom this week. In English, the children have sequenced and written their own versions of Dick Whittington. They really impressed us with the details that they included. In RE, the children did a fantastic job discussing what is special to them. We related this to the idea of shrines in different religions. The room was filled with excitement as we received our letters from Santa reminding us to bring in green prizes for the Year 2 raffle hamper. Hope you all have a lovely weekend.

Year 3: Year 3 have been working really hard on their Katia Krafft diary entries this week. They have really thought about using their senses to describe witnessing a volcano eruption. They have done a great job of including key features like first person and past tense verbs. In maths, our learning has moved on to multiplication and division, we have been looking at making equal groups and arrays this week. In RE, we learnt what People of God meant and how Christian's today show that they are People of God linking this to our Bible story, Noah's Ark. In science, we investigated the north and south pole on magnets and how the forces repel or attract each other. In topic, we learnt how tornadoes are formed and the interesting job of storm chasing. It has been a great week in year 3, well done for all of your hard work!

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Year 4: What a wonderful week we've had in Year 4! The children have amazed us with their mountain-inspired short stories, cleverly using grammar features like subordinating clauses to make their writing shine. In maths, they've been busy exploring different ways to calculate the perimeter of polygons, showing real determination and teamwork. Thursday was especially exciting as our Year 4 team took part in the big Speed Stacking competition – we were all so proud of how brilliantly they represented us! Our PE lesson brought lots of smiles too, with rhythmic movement outside making the most of the fresh air. The children were absolutely delighted to receive their letters from Father Christmas, which added a magical touch to the week. To finish, Friday's spirituality day gave us the chance to be creative and reflective, with thought-provoking activities on incarnation that really captured the children's imagination.

Year 5: It has been a bit of an unusual week in some ways, but Year 5 have coped really well! We welcomed Mrs Old on Monday and Mrs Lea on Tuesday, and they both said how much they enjoyed working with the pupils. We've continued our work on fractions, explored how to construct a scene from a story in graphic novel form, used the boomwhackers to create a class performance of Jingle Bells and talked about Christian charities and the importance of supporting and giving to others, particularly at this time of year. Well done, Year 5, on your resilience, cheerfulness and hard work!

Year 6: Year 6 have had a very enjoyable week by finishing reading Holes and celebrating with biscuits while watching the film version. There was much debate over which parts stayed true to the book and which scenes had been changed or left out. In English, we compared character portrayals in the book and the film, focusing on how facial expressions, tone and camera angles can completely alter how a character is seen. Mr Sir proved a favourite example, described as strict and expressionless in the book but far more exaggerated and entertaining on screen. We wrote comparison paragraphs explaining why the director might have chosen to present characters differently and how this changed the audience's view. In D&T, we took inspiration from the story itself and made our own 'Sploosh', a spiced peach creation that looked surprisingly edible and smelled even better... At least that's Mr D's feedback... In Maths, we continued our SATs preparation, multiplying and dividing fractions and practising test-style questions with calm determination.

* For Year 6 homework, children have been encouraged to revisit their Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling SATs paper using the Rollama link I have provided on Google Classroom - to improve on any of those tricky questions.


