Little Lawrences: Christmas has begun in Little Lawrences and we have been sharing our stories about trees, elves and Christmas Wishes. On Monday we proudly showcased our Christmas Nativity with Reception class to parents. This was a HUGE achievement for all the children who took part and we are all feeling very proud of ourselves! This week we have introduced our book advent calendar; where using the numbers we can identify whose turn it is to open a present and then we share our Christmas story of the day. We also welcomed new children for their settling in sessions in preparation for January.



Reception : This week has been a busy one in Reception class! It was lovely to see so many of you at 'Our First Nativity' play on Monday. We were so proud of all of the children for their courage to perform on a stage and for their wonderful singing. They made us all smile so much. We then had a very exciting trip to Warwick Arts Centre on Tuesday, to see 'The Tiger who came to Tea', a story that is loved by both the adults and the children. The children were exceptionally well behaved and were a credit to our school. On Wednesday the children looked fabulous in their Christmas jumpers and have all contributed to some lovely class decorations. The children have enjoyed learning about advent and the advent wreath and have shared lots of tales of the mischief the cheeky elves have caused at some of their houses!

Year 1: Year 1 have had a very exciting week and it's beginning to feel a lot like Christmas! We've been busy rehearsing for our nativity and the children are getting more confident every day. There has been lots of singing, dancing and trying on costumes, with the excitement building as we look forward to performing in front of our families next week. We also loved showing off our Christmas jumpers this week, which added even more festive cheer. We also enjoyed our very first coach trip out of school to see The Tiger Who Came to Tea. It was such good fun and the children were amazing. The tiger was especially cheeky and made everyone laugh, making it a trip we will remember for a long time. What a wonderful, festive week it's been in Year 1!

Year 2: What a busy and exciting week we have had in Year 2. We are still busy rehearsing our Nativity. We hope you are looking forward to it next week. We are sure that you will be impressed as the children have worked so hard on learning the songs and their lines. We had the fantastic opportunity to visit the theatre and see a real like professional performance on Tuesday. 'The Tiger who came to tea' made us smile, laugh and dance along. We were so proud of the children's behaviour on the coach and in the theatre. All of the staff who went were so impressed and we all really enjoyed seeing the delight on the children's faces. Thank you to the parents who accompanied us and also an extra thank you to Mrs Ashton for sharing a little memento of the occasion with all the children. In between all the acting and singing, we have still managed to find the time to finish our work on Dick Whittington. The children wrote some very bossy command sentences as if they were the cook. In addition, if you need to sell anything, the children produced some very convincing advertising posters for Tom the cat, sharing his numerous mouse-catching skills. Have a lovely weekend and remember the Christmas Fayre if you're feeling like a festive treat.

Year 3: Year 3 have had a fabulous week this week! We have been reading the Nutcracker in English and are beginning to feel very Christmassy! We have been planning a new scene for the Nutcracker and the children have chosen somewhere completely unique and magical to set their scene. I have seen some beautiful sounding crystal caves, icy palaces and candy floss lands. All of which I am so excited to read about next week when we write our new scenes. In maths, we have been learning about multiplying in 2s, 5s, 10s and 3s and looked at sharing and grouping as ways of dividing. We have been learning about climate change in topic this week and have made some nice posters to share knowledge of climate change and suggest ways we can make a change to help limit its effects. Well done for another week working so hard!

Year 4: This week in Year 4 has been full of fantastic learning! The children created excellent stained-glass window artwork in RE, carefully designing pieces that linked beautifully to our class themes. In Topic, we explored different types of glaciers and the children really enjoyed discovering how they form and move. In English, the class worked hard on understanding and applying the difference between their, there and they're, using them accurately in their own sentences. In Maths, we practised calculating area, and everyone showed great perseverance while using the methods to work out the size of different shapes. Overall, it's been a wonderful week of creativity, curiosity and confidence! And to finish, a picture of Monty and George P experimenting on the solubility of different products.



Year 5: This week, Year 5 continued reading Race the Frozen North. We noticed how hungry Matthew Henson after he ran away from home and how this is shown through the descriptions of his food. We looked at how food is described in different books and wrote our own narrative extracts involving food. It made my tummy rumble and I think I heard a few others too! Our topic work brought us up to date as we heard about scientists in Antarctica. We learnt about their important work and what life is like living in a research station. In science, we looked at solubility and investigated whether different substances were soluble or insoluble. Finally, we continued our work on fractions. We gained confidence comparing and adding fractions with different denominators including showing our understanding with bar models. Well done Year 5!

Year 6: Year 6 have stepped confidently into the world of 'The Polar Express' this week and enjoyed it so much that we finished the book in record time. We explored atmosphere and emotion through reading, sketching and discussion, learning how the author uses language to create a sense of wonder and quiet anticipation. The class produced detailed descriptive paragraphs of the boarding scene, drawing on sensory imagery and adventurous vocabulary before editing their drafts to improve clarity and precision. We continued this work through art and design by creating our own golden tickets filled with meaningful words such as hope and belief, and we compared how the book and film present the magical journey north. In Maths, we have multiplied and divided fractions with growing confidence and begun to look at SATs style reasoning papers so that we can identify areas we need to strengthen. In Topic, we examined the causes, impacts and prevention of wildfires and wrote organised information texts using technical vocabulary and a formal tone. In RE, we explored how funerals reflect beliefs about life after death across a range of worldviews, noting both similarities and differences in ritual and symbolism.


